#### **DIRECTIONS**

ACE is situated a very short distance from Junction 1 of the M50.

IF YOU ARE USING A SATNAV....

Please use the postcode GL20 6DB. This will take you to Brockeridge Road, just outside of Twyning. When your satnav reaches this point, please pick up from the directions below. From the M50 roundabout, please do not use the A38 towards Tewkesbury. Please DO NOT use either Cherry Orchard Lane, or Pages Lane to get to us, this will definitely upset our neighbours!

If you are coming from Ross on the M50, leave the motorway at junction 1, signposted Tewkesbury, take the 2nd exit signed Tewkesbury A38. Under motorway. Take the 1st left at the next roundabout signed Ledbury (as if you were going back on the M50). Turn right over the cattle grid before entering the motorway slip, signposted Brockeridge Business Park & Twyning. Proceed up the hill through the 30mph signs and then take the next right signposted Church End. Then take the second left into Ace Cross Country.

If you are coming from the M5, take Junction 8 off the M5 for M50 South Wales & Ross. Leave the motorway at junction 1 of the M50, signposted Malvern A38. Immediately on leaving the motorway, before you reach the roundabout, turn left over the cattle grid, signposted Brockeridge Business Park & Twyning. Proceed up the hill through the 30mph signs and then take the next right signposted Church End. Then take the second left into Ace Cross Country.

#### **GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

- 1. The committee reserve the right to cancel, amend or alter the order of events.
- 2. The committee reserve the right to refuse entry or disqualify any animal that is deemed unfit to compete.
- 3. The committee and landowners will not be responsible for any injuries arising from accidents to persons or animals, or theft of properties on the grounds during the event.
- 4. The Judges and the Committee's decision shall be final on all matters during the event.
- 5. Any objections are to be handed to the Secretary in writing within 30 minutes of the incident, with a deposit of £20 to be forfeited if the objection is not upheld.
- 6. This showground is kindly lent to us; the show is run entirely by volunteers. Anyone using unreasonable behaviour, bad language, dropping litter, mucking out on the showground, mistreating any animal or anything else that affect the Club's reputation, will be asked to leave the showground.
- 7. Hard hats are compulsory at all times when mounted and must conform to the current BRC safety standards. Riders competing in the Area qualifier must have a visible **AQUA** tag in place. Body Protectors are recommended for jumping classes.
- 8. All horses and ponies must be at least 4 years old to compete.
- 9. All dogs must be kept on leads at all times; failure to do so will result in you being asked to leave the showground. Please clear up after your dog.
- 10. All classes will be run under current British Riding Club rules.
- 11. Strictly no cantering / galloping on the showground, except in the practice rings provided.
- 12. Stallions are eligible to compete at this show, but all BRC rules apply and stallion discs must be worn on both sides of the bridle.
- 13. All horses on the showground must have been vaccinated against Equine Influenza. Passports **will** be checked for all horses competing in the Area qualifier and spot checks may be done for all other horses. Please make your passport available when picking up your number from the secretary.
- 14. All riders must be covered by third party insurance to compete at this event.

**LEGAL LIABILITY**: Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or for anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor the Riding Club, nor any agent, employee, or representative of these bodies, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, vehicles, their content and accessories or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.

**HEALTH, SAFETY & WELFARE:** The Organisers of this event have taken every reasonable precaution to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers, Officials and Stewards. Additionally, those attending this event must report incidents or accidents to the Secretary involving Property or Vehicle Damage, Personal Injury or Personal Illness.
